

GERMANY (TEENSTREET)

When: July 29 - August 9, 2020

Purpose: Join teens from around the world praising and worshipping the Lord through learning seminars, art, dance, and large and small group activities. Adults participate in the seminars and chaperone activities.

Cost: \$1650

Leader: Jody Shannon

About the Ministry: TeenStreet is an international Christian conference for teens. They work with the church to inspire and equip young people to have a real relationship with Jesus.

Q: Do I need a passport/visa?

A: You must have a valid passport through February 9 of 2021 (six months after the trip). Getting a new passport can take up to eight weeks. A visa is not required to enter Germany.

Q: Do I need any specific immunizations?

A: No

Q: What does trip preparation look like?

A: Prayer plus attending all required informational meetings and trainings (three total). Coaches of a small group should complete the supplied Bible studies prior to leaving for TeenStreet.

Q: Where will we stay and what should I wear?

A: Service Team and Prayer Partners stay in same gender tents with adults; a hotel is an option, for an additional cost. Coaches sleep in the mass housing with teens. Summers in Germany are like ours in Texas, so summer attire with a light jacket for evenings is recommended.

Q: What does a typical day look like?

A: Adults serve by engaging and drawing teens close to Jesus during the week. Those serving in different areas have a schedule that depends on their area of ministry. Coaches and teens have the same schedule.

8 a.m. – Breakfast

9:30 a.m. – Large Group worship and teaching

11 a.m. – Shhh Time and Small Group

1 p.m. – Lunch

2:15 p.m. – Interaction Time

(seminars, outreach, workshops, free time)

6 p.m. – Dinner & Small Group Time

7:30 p.m. – Throne Room (Worship)

9 p.m. – Interaction Time (free time)

10:30 p.m. – Small Group

11:30 p.m. – Lights Out

Q: Do I need to speak German?

A: No! Everything is in English (translated to German on stage). Most students/adults speak English as well.

Q: What does the trip cost include and when is it due?

A: Trip cost is \$1650 and includes airfare, lodging in the on-site mass accommodations, meals during the conference, and transportation. An additional \$200 for incidentals is recommended for meals during travel, souvenirs, etc. A deposit is due mid-April, with final payment due June 20, 2020.
