When: June 11-22, 2020

Purpose: Engage in street evangelism in one of the most culturally diverse areas of Madrid.

Cost: \$2300

Leader: Said Garcia

Q: Do I need a passport/visa?

A: You must have a valid passport through Dec. of 2020 (six months after the trip). Getting a new passport can take up to eight weeks. A visa is not required to enter Spain.

Q: Do I need any specific immunizations?

A: Recommended routine vaccines, and Hep A, Hep B. For a complete list please visit www.cdc.gov/travel.

Q: What does trip preparation look like?

A: Your trip leader will schedule and host six team meetings prior to the trip. These meetings are required and beneficial for team-building, safety, and spiritual/cultural preparedness.

Q: Where will we stay and what should I wear?

A: We will stay in a hotel located on a quiet street in the center of Madrid. We wear light and comfortable clothes and shoes for daily walks. The temperature in June is usually between 80 and 90 degrees F during the day, and between 60 and 70 degrees F in the morning. A light jacket and jeans are recommended too. One or two changes in casual clothes are necessary.

Q: What does a typical day look like?

A: A regular day looks like this:

8 a.m. to 8:45 a.m. – Breakfast in hotel / Short team meeting (*debrief of the day before*)

10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. – Working with other local ministries / engaging in street evangelism

1 p.m. – Lunch time (*This time is a great opportunity for having conversations with local people.*)

2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. – Tea Break / nap time / take a shower (*Last two at the hotel*)

4 p.m. to 5 p.m. – Team devotional in hotel

6 p.m. to 9 p.m. – Working with other local ministries / engaging in street evangelism

9 p.m. to 11 p.m.* – Bed time / or taking a walk to visit interesting buildings and places around the hotel area (*This is another great opportunity to engage people in conversations.*)

*Due to the Spanish lifestyle, people are outside in the streets, squares, restaurants, and other parts of the city until even later than midnight. The city is very safe and protected by the police personnel.

Q: Do I need to speak Spanish?

A: While speaking Spanish is a plus, it is not required. Translators will be arranged as needed.

Q: What does the trip cost include and when is it due?

A: Trip cost includes airfare, lodging, meals, supplies, and transportation. Free-day activities are not covered. Half the cost is due eight weeks before the trip, and the remaining amount is due two weeks prior to departure. Do not let the trip cost prevent you from going; the trip leader will provide resources for fundraising.
